THE PRESENT PERFECT TENSE

Resaltemos el uso del presente perfecto para:

Acontecimientos que ya han tenido cabida en el pasado, aunque todavía cuentan con alta importancia en la actualidad; esta es su diferencia con el pasado simple

Existen varios tiempos dentro de este que son: presente perfecto simple y continuo, los cuales mantienen la misma estructura semántica del presente.

Relax que ya llegaremos a la explicación y ahí sí que todo/as vamos a comprender a la perfección, continuemos...

El verbo auxiliar en este caso es TO HAVE. Sin embargo, ten presente que en el caso de tercera persona, la conjugación sería HAS.

I have done – Yo he hecho

You have done – Tú has hecho

She has done – Ella ha hecho

He has done – Él ha hecho

It has – Eso ha

We have done – Nosotros hemos hecho

You have done – Ustedes han hecho

They have done – Ellos han hecho

Posteriormente, se sigue con el verbo de la acción en pasado perfecto.

Quedando la ecuación gramatical general del presente perfecto simple de la siguiente forma:

Sujeto + auxiliar HAVE / HAS + verbo pasado participio + complemento

I + have + done + the homework (Yo he hecho la tarea)

She + has + cooked + spaguettis (Ella ha cocinado espaguetis)

Ejemplos de presente perfecto

Asimismo, como en los demás tiempos verbales, las oraciones en presente perfecto también son de afirmación, de negación y de pregunta.

Es por este motivo que vamos pasamos a realizar ejemplos con cada uno de estos aspectos para que tengas una claridad en el tema.

Frases afirmativas

Sujeto + auxiliar HAVE / HAS + verbo pasado participio + complemento

You have done a great job!

He has walked for 2 hours

We have played tennis since 9am

Oraciones en presente perfecto negativas

Sujeto + auxiliar HAVE / HAS en negación + verbo pasado participio + complemento

They haven't eaten eggs yet

You have gone mad!

She has dreamed with dragonflies

Interrogativas

Auxiliar HAVE / HAS + sujeto + verbo pasado participio + complemento?

Have you gone to Alaska?

Has he driven very fast?

Has she worked in that company before?

Como ya lo vez, las oraciones en presente perfecto en inglés son fáciles de construir, siempre y cuando mantengamos la ecuación de referencia.

Adicionalmente, al hacer uso del presente perfecto en inglés , se hace bastante interesante complementar con adverbios de tiempo.

Esto ya que estamos conectando el pasado con el presente, así que veamos rápidamente algunos adverbios de tiempo para darnos una idea:

Since (desde)

For (durante)

Early (temprano)

Later (después)

Before (antes)

Then (entonces, luego)

Just (justo)

Has notado que los verbos en presente perfecto son en pasado participio, verdad? Pues Leer con atención la información que se dara a continuación. Es muy importante para entender y poder realizar las actividades de esta guía .

Grammatical Rules (*Reglas gramaticales*)

Form (*Forma*)

Para formar el presente perfecto, se usa el verbo auxiliar “to have” en el presente y el participio pasado del verbo.
Para verbos regulares, el participio pasado es la forma simple del pasado.

PRESENT PERFECT

AFFIRMATIVE

S+have/has+V^o(participio/+ed/3^acol)

I **have** played

He **has** gone

NEGATIVE

S+haven't/hasn't+V^o(+ed/3^a)

I **haven't** played

He **hasn't** gone

INTERROGATIVE

Have/Has+S+V^o(+ed/3^a)

Have you played?

Has she gone?

HAVE / HAS + PAST PARTICIPLE

AFF.: They **have arrived** / He **has arrived**.

NEG.: They **haven't arrived** / He **hasn't arrived**.

INT.: **Have** they **arrived**? / **Has** he **arrived**?

USED FOR:

- An event that happened at a non-specific time in the past

- Something that started in the past and is still true now
